

"Lisa is the head cook at Cornerstone Rescue Mission and overnight had to immediately make adjustments to the meals she was to prepare and serve at the Mission. It went from doing breakfast and lunch 5 days a week to prepping and arranging service of 3 meals a day 7 days a week. Many of our volunteers had to stop due to health concerns, and although many still supplied food, it was up to Lisa to prep and arrange service. Then once again a change was made and suddenly there was an overwhelming need for sack lunches to provide food to individuals that could not dine at the facility, or were in quarantine. Not only did she have to arrange the meals to be served, she now needed to also make meals that could be picked up for those in need – all from food that was not from a planned menu. Feeding South Dakota, local churches, and organizations were very generously supplying food but not in a typical shopping list. One day there may be lunch meat but the next produce, sweet goods, or leftover pizza. No order, no particular quantity –



just a need to turn it into a nutritional meal whether hot or cold or in a sack lunch. Not an easy task when you need to serve hundreds of meals a day. Lisa does it all with a positive, down to business attitude and always has a kind word to say to lift someone else up. She takes the cancellations, adjustments, and last minute changes all in stride and does her best to promote doing so in a safe and efficient manner. Many days she works over ten hours and goes home exhausted but we can count on her to come back the next morning ready to do it all again. Thank you Lisa! Your dedication and service to those less fortunate in our community is truly a blessing!"
